The situation looked very grim with her being hospitalized. We were told that her recovery would be long and serious. Expect weeks in the hospital with months of rehab. That is until the Lord showed His hand and she was released home within 10 days and is improving daily. The medical community is in awe, yet we know who's responsible. That lady is needed at home and the ministry.

So the last half of January and most of February were spent in recuperation mode. This virus and it's effects are for real and we continue to pray for friends and relatives that have on going struggles. There is a bright side though, Greg

It is stable and the Romanian people are welcoming refugees at various locations. Many of our friends and partnering churches and organizations are mobilized to help, in both Romania and Moldova. Our greater concern is in helping those with disabilities both now in Ukraine and those who are able to leave. While in Romania, Greg will discuss how we can be of help.

March 17 through April 5, Greg will be traveling to Romania. A disability conference in Oradea is scheduled, meetings with church and local leaders in Bucharest,

Brasov, Oradea, Arad, Timisoara and Constanta are being planned. Our original plans for this trip was in the

fall of 2021. Given the current events, the Lord is sovereign and His plans never fail. In addition, we were approached by the worship team of a local church, New Life Downtown, to see if a missions/worship team to Romania this June would be possible. Our first response is always to pray, but this one was funny. See, 3 years ago, our friends at Alfa Christian in Brasov, came to us with this very request. We have been praying about this with them and so we told the worship pastor he could very well be an answer to prayer. While there in March, Greg will be scouting details for this potential upcoming opportunity.

St. Anton's has been provided a huge answer to prayer. In October 2018, we saw firsthand that a new roof was necessary. The staff has been fighting the ongoing battle to repair the damage caused by a leaky roof. Unfortunately, the

cost was over \$25,000. Well, through local suppliers and the county, materials have been provided to replace the roof with a new metal one. Materials, not labor. There is a small maintenance staff at the orphanage that can provide unskilled labor, but skilled roofers are needed. The cost is approximately \$2000.

Now that we, Carol included, are getting healthy and ready to get going, here are some upcoming prayer requests.

- 1. A board of directors we asked John Nix to join us with the specific task of forming a strong, younger, committed group of servants to lead the ministry into the future.
- 2. Further development of the digital resources websites, social media, digital content are just a few areas we are continually working on. Pray the Lord brings to us those with gifts and a vision to help the disabled.
- 3. Greg's upcoming trip to Romania March 17 April 5. Divine appointments, wisdom, safety and a clear picture of how we can help in this crisis.
- 4. St Anton's outside of Brasov, Romania on going struggles to maintain a level of care and comfort for the 100 severely disabled orphaned adults. Funds for labor for the new roof.
- 5. Mephibosheth Ministry for wisdom and favor as we take this into the future, both locally here in the US and abroad where the Lord opens doors.
